# Alternative Manufacturing, Inc. (AMI) Supports Maine Technology Startup Company

**MI in** Winthrop is now manufacturing and shipping electronic equipment to support a startup company in Central Maine. Invisible Intelligence, LLC, based in Gardiner, designs equipment for recording radio transmissions at general aviation airports. Smaller airports, like the Augusta State Airport, do not have control towers, but rely on anyone using the airstrips to announce their intentions over the radio. Safety is obviously a critical concern for pilots and airport maintenance crews who need to know whether a runway is occupied. The General Audio Recording Device (G.A.R.D.), designed by Invisible Intelligence, is a "black box" that records all radio communication occurring at the airport and timestamps each transmission. G.A.R.D. provides the information needed for accident investigation, personnel training and runway usage data.

With nearly 25 years of electronics manufacturing experience and a focus on low and medium-volume production, AMI was able to provide the expertise needed to deliver this product to market. AMI assisted in getting the company's prototype upgraded to a production-ready design. The

production of the printed circuit board, cabling and integration into its final enclosure all takes place at AMI's Winthrop manufacturing facility. Production is expected to increase as the product has recently been adopted by Maine DOT and is being evaluated by other agencies that manage the country's 5000+general aviation airports.
